At this time of the year preparation for the ground and raised beds is needed to ensure that the seeds and plants have a good chance of growing.

At present the polytunnel beds have had topsoil and chicken poo put into them over the winter, to ensure that they have a good structure to the contents of the earth.

We have a good composting system in the allotment area, which enables the school garden areas to be supported with good quality compost which is free.

The Garden Club have organised their crop rotation vegetables and will be starting to plant the seeds and crops with the children in the polytunnel to start with and then they will be planted out in the allotment area and junior section of the gardens.
