Definition

The aim of Personal, Social and Health Education and Citizenship is to provide planned learning experiences to promote the skills, knowledge and understanding that pupils need to lead confident, healthy, independent lives, to make and maintain responsible relationships and to enable them to play an active role as citizens. It promotes the development of positive self-esteem and self-confidence so that children achieve their maximum potential, and become independent while also having a sense of responsibility to others.

Pupils are encouraged to take part in a wide range of activities and experiences across and beyond the curriculum. In doing so they learn to recognise their own worth, work well with others and become increasingly responsible for their own learning.

Aims

Ashton Vale Primary School promotes a caring stimulating environment with high standards. We want children's learning to be a positive, enriching, experience where individuals can achieve their maximum potential. Through all aspects of school life children are encouraged to develop their individuality as well as a tolerance and understanding of others. We promote a respect for moral values, and an understanding of different traditions and cultures.

There are opportunities for teaching P.S.H.M.E. in all areas of school life including in the classroom, through whole school activities and extra curricular events. The home is the main centre of learning in P.S.H.M.E. and by it's partnership with parents the school seeks to build upon this.
