## Accepting Emails can be Dangerous

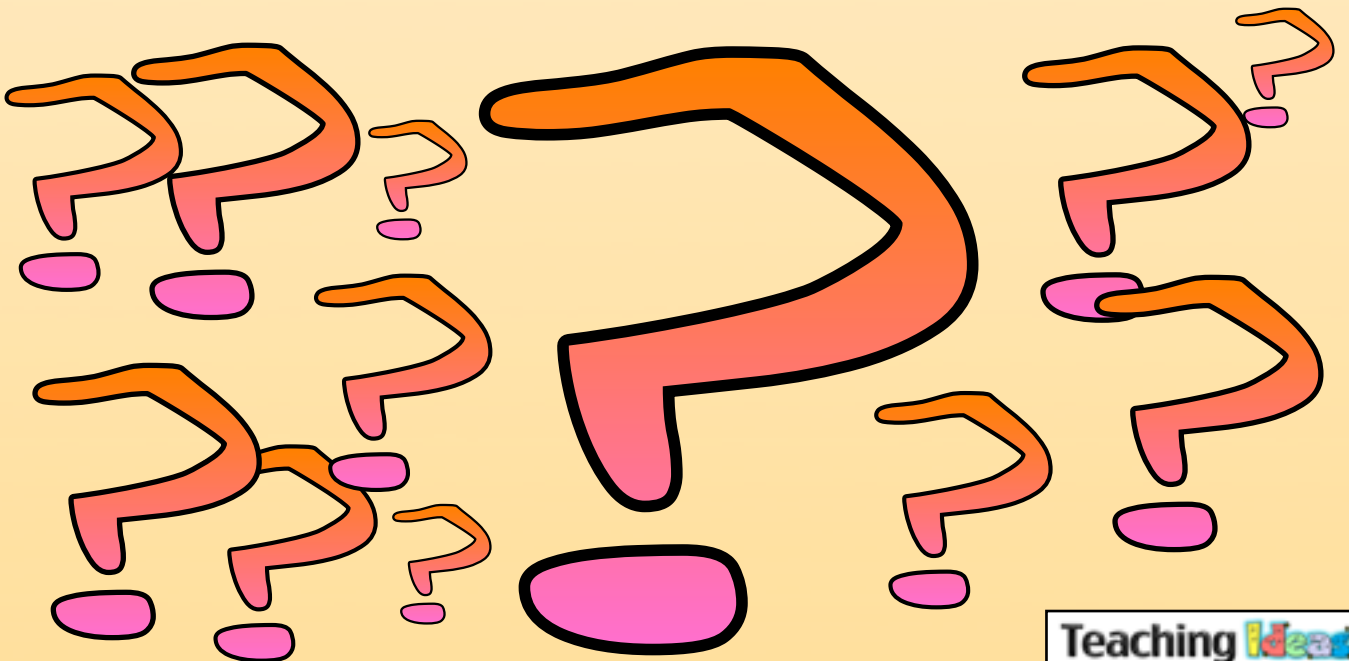
If you receive junk mail (called Spam) or messages which make you feel uncomfortable, tell an adult that you trust and delete them. Don't reply to them!

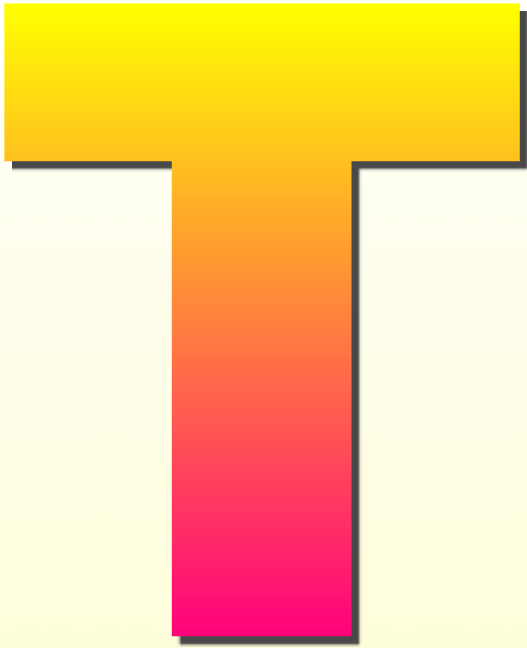




# Reliable?
